Unification church members denounce Soviet action

Americans cannot allow the Soviet attack on 007 to be forgotten as just another historical director of the Interna-Myung Moon's Unification Church.

"The Soviets accuse others of doing just what it does," he said.

"We're coming to a time where America recognizes the need for spiritual renewal," he said, standing next to a banner which proclaimed "Victory Over Communism. One World Family Under God." "One World Family is not idealistic," he said.

People have fewer differences than similarities, such as humanity and a common sense of being, Payer said.

"We (Americans) need a new philosphical struc-ture," he said.

He said that an obstacle to the One World Family is the belief that some types of Christianity are better than others. He said that there exists a source, a purpose and a common destiny in all denominations.

Midway through the lecture, Payer began caring for a wound on his right hand. When later asked about his ailment, he explained that earlier Thursday, he was struck by a piece of a burning Soviet flag which he and members of his group set on fire at a rally on the outdoor Centrum plaza at 12th and O.

Payer and Peter Nagle, another member of IOWC, were subsequently jailed for disturbing the peace. Both were released on \$50 bond Thursday afternoon.

Program to tackle Big Red litter

After Saturday's football game, 40 junior and senior high students from the Lincoln area will pick up litter around Memorial Stadium as part of the new Keep Our Campus Clean Program.

Sponsored by ASUN and the Lincoln-Lancaster Clean Community System, an affiliate of Keep America Beautiful, the cleanup's main goal is to make fans aware of the post-game litter problem.

"The first step is get-ting people aware that littering isn't socially acceptable," said Ginny Bauer, system coordinator.

Bauer said money saved by using volunteers could be used by the UNL Grounds Department for other projects. She also commended

ASUN for realizing there is a problem and for

showing its concern.
ASUN First Vice President Regina Rogers, who is coordinating the pro-ject for ASUN, said Saturday's activities will be used as a test to "work out the bugs" in the new program. She said she expects all university departments eventually will participate in the litter-reduction program of Keep Our Campus Clean.

Wilbur Dasenbrock, director of the grounds department, said that after games, crews can put in 80-150 hours cleaning up around the stadium. Work includes emptying extra litter containers and cleaning parking areas and malls leading to the stadium.

Although the volunteers won't be able to cover all the areas on Saturday, Dasenbrock said, "40 kids

working for one or two hours should give us considerable help."

The volunteers are affiliated with the Lincoln Red Cross Youth Volunteers in Action. They will wear "Clean Machine T-shirts.

Rogers said she anticipates the cleanup will help people become aware of litter problems.

"People will hopefully remember (not to litter) at the next game."
