"On the down side, it's a loss," Cunningham said. "Nebraska has a great tradition, and they're rough to beat."

Cunningham said he didn't think Wyoming would schedule Nebraska in the near future.

"Right now, we're trying to play people home and home," he said.

## Sports Shorts

**BASKETBALL TICKETS** — The athletic department ticket office will offer students a choice of season basketball tickets this year, Jean Walcott, of the ticket office, said.

The first choice includes 18 home games at \$13 for a single ticket, \$26 for married student tickets.

The second choice includes the three home games scheduled during the semester break. Cost is \$25 for a single ticket, \$38 for married student tickets. Each extra game will cost \$4, the price of public tickets.

Applications for tickets will be accepted at the ticket office Sept. 26 through 30 from 9 a.m. to noon and from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. Applications are available at Administration Building 204, East Union information desk or at the ticket office.

Basketball ticket distribution will be decided by the lottery system for the first time.

Students can pick up their tickets between Oct. 24 and 28. Full-time student ID cards must be presented at that time.

Walcott said judging from the number of non-student applications already received, more students will be applying for basketball tickets this year than usual.

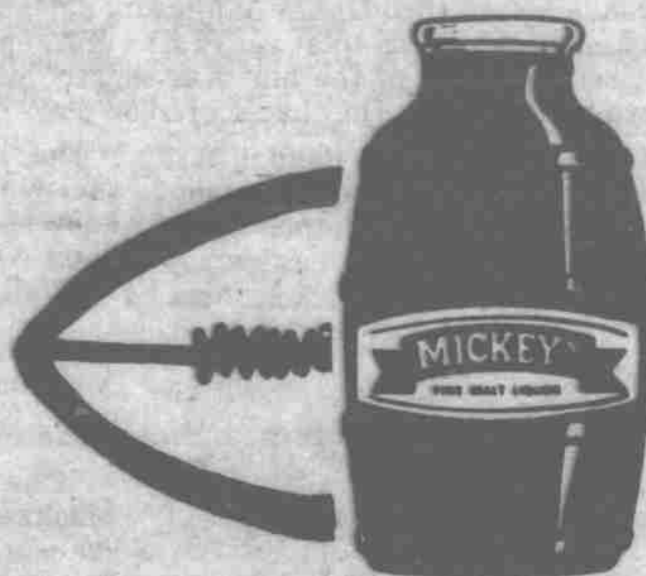
