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Althouse said that of the women's team members, Debi Morrison has had the most experience in jumping. Morrison finished fifth in the event last year.

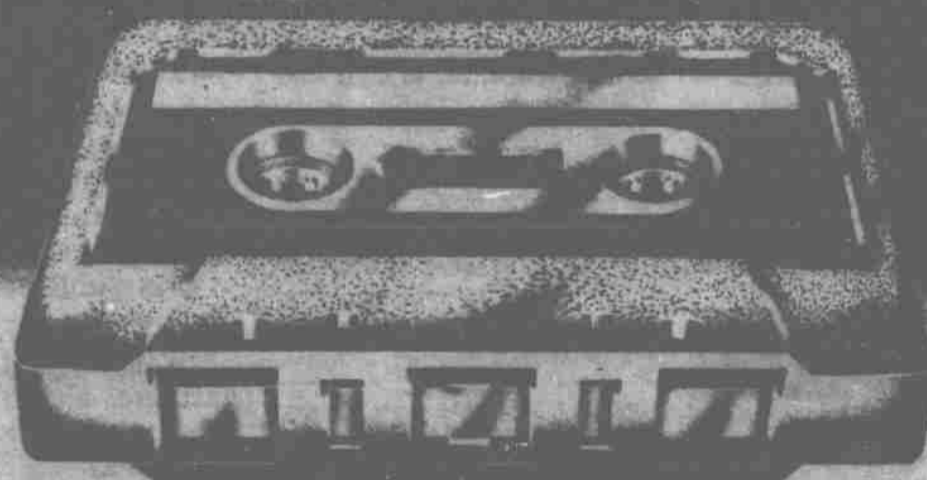
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
