President postpones visit to Philippines

WASHINGTON — President Reagan has indefinitely postponed plans to visit the Philippines as well as Thailand and Indonesia in November because of his preoccupation with key issues in Congress, White House spokesman Larry Speakes said Monday. He said Reagan would visit Japan and South Korea next month, although dates might have to be rearranged.

Reagan has been under heavy pressure in Congress and other quarters not to go to the Philippines because of the assassination of Philippines opposition leader Benigno Aquino in Manila in August.

Speakes said the president made the decision because he thought he should remain in Washington during a crucial period of congressional debates.

In Manila, a senior foreign minister said the government was disappointed.

"This is something of a shock," the official said, "because whatever the reasons are for postponing the visit, it will be interpreted in some quarters as a loss of confidence in the country."

Cease-fire marred

BEIRUT — Tank or artillery shells and machine-gun fire Monday shook southern Beirut suburbs as the army fought leftist gunmen in the worst violation of the week-old cease-fire, residents reported. The fighting did not affect the downtown area and ended at night-fall. The Saudi-mediated cease-fire, which a week ago ended a month of fighting in Beirut and the mountains, held in other parts of Beirut.

Porpoises find body

COROLLA, N.C. — Authorities have credited a school of porpoises with finding the body of a 17-year-old boy who drowned Saturday while swimming off a lonely stretch of ocean beach. The body of Kevin Cherry was found floating in shallow water as three porpoises nudged it toward the beach, rescue workers said. Barry Nelms, a marine biologist, said porpoises have been known to help people in trouble.

Arizona skies clear

TUCSON, Ariz. — The death toll rose to 10 Monday and thousands of homes and tens of thousands of acres of farmland remained flooded after more rain — four to eight inches — fell on Arizona this weekend than usually falls in a year. After five days of rain, the skies cleared Monday, enabling people in some areas who had spent nights in emergency shelters to begin clearing away the thick mud filling their homes. No official estimate of the damage has been given, but state authorities said the final figure would be above \$100 million.

Arizona Gov. Bruce Babbitt, who declared a state of emergency in southern Arizona yesterday, met with federal authorities Monday to discuss federal aid for flood victims.

AT&T presents rate plan

WASHINGTON — American Telephone and Telegraph Co. Monday proposed reducing long-distance telephone rates 10.5 percent, but many customers still will see their total phone bills increase. The decreases will save customers \$2 billion in 1984 and are the biggest rate cuts ever, Morris Tanenbaum, an AT&T executive, said.

The new interstate rates, proposed to the Federal Communications Commission, would take effect Jan. 1. The rate plan includes a new charge of 75 cents every time a call is made to the long-distance information operator and would require customers to pay their local phone company a monthly access charge — \$2 for residential phones, increasing in later years, and \$6 for business phones.

Critics of the plan say the shift to the new system of charges will mean customers' total bills will be higher.
