The Nicaraguan Council of State may be more representative than the U.S. Congress, Campbell suggested, because various groups, including women, clergy, the army, various political parties and other parties in the private sector choose their own representatives.

"We cannot understand how those programs can be construed as a threat to the United States," Campbell said. Accusations that Nicaragua supplies arms to rebels in El Salvador have never been supported by evidence, and U.S. intervention in Central America long predates the Cold War, he said.

"It's not too late, but the voices of reason are going to have to prevail on the administration of the United States... that changes in Central America are inevitable."

He said arrogance and race prejudice are reasons why the United States has intervened in Nicaragua to aid in insurgent counter-revolutionary movement.

"The U.S. has always considered everything south of the border a U.S. preserve" open for political and economic convenience, he said.

Campbell admitted the Sandinista government has made errors.

"A little over four years ago most of us were guerrillas in the mountains... The next day (after the revolution) you're an administrator," he said. "We're learning on the job. We know of some countries that have two hundred year histories and continue to make mistakes."

"The students couldn't use the old machines," said Mike Chu, an assistant English instructor. "The functions of the old machines were limited."

Tandberg IS9, the new machine in use at the laboratory, allows several groups of students to work with different programs simultaneously. The more advanced Tandberg also has a recap key that allows the student to automatically rewind tapes to the last sentence the student has heard.
