

Workshop aids faculty in conflict situations

Reaching a group consensus about a certain controversial situation proved to be difficult at a workshop Wednesday in the Nebraska Union.

The workshop, directed by Edith Seashore, a nationally prominent social psychologist, attracted about 40 UNL faculty members. The purpose of the workshop, Seashore said, was to present theories and applications relating to the management of differences in various university settings.

The workshop's major event involved faculty members dividing into groups and discussing a certain controversial situation presented to them by Seashore. The goal of the groups, she said, was to arrive at one consensus among all group members. This was difficult, but that is what Seashore expected.

"People need to bring out their values to make decisions," Seashore said. "There is no right or wrong answer."

Group interaction at the workshop was directed toward the faculty members, who will be able to take what they learned about group discussions back to their respective departments at UNL, she said.

Dawneanne Munn, a faculty member in the UNL School of Nursing, said she used the workshop as a tool to become more aware in dealing with conflict in group situations.

"This workshop will be useful at faculty and committee meetings to help make the best decision," Munn said.

Munn said that the workshop also taught her to be a more active listener in the group decision-making process.

Seashore said the major types of differences in a group decision-making process involved values, facts methods and goals.

Seashore, who lives in Washington, is in Lincoln as a visiting scholar to the ADAPT program through a Layman grant.

ADAPT is a program composed of 40 select freshmen who enroll in one of three ADAPT courses at UNL. The ADAPT courses help the students to learn and think more constructively.
