Sign language interpreter to perform

Susan Freundlich, a nationally renowned sign language interpreter, will perform her one-woman show tonight at the Nebraska Center for Continuing Education.

Freundlich's show combines dance and mime with sign language to interpret songs for both deaf and hearing audiences.

She has performed throughout the United States and Canada and has interpreted songs for the deaf at concerts by Holly Near, Pete Seeger, Arlo Guthrie, The Weavers and many others.

She also has worked as a sign language coach and interpreter for the cast of the Broadway show "Children of a Lesser God."

The Lincoln Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf sponsors the show, which begins at 8 p.m. Tickets are \$5 for adults, \$2 for children. They can be purchased at the door.
