

ASUN studies effectiveness of UNL academic advising

The effectiveness of academic advising currently is the topic of study for ASUN academic policies committee.

At the senate's weekly meeting Wednesday, Sen. John Valdrighi said surveys about advising have been distributed to most deans. UNL advising procedures are coordinated either by colleges or by departments within each college, he said.

"It's a pretty diversified thing to study," Valdrighi said. "We don't know if there's even a problem with academic advising. We just want to know how we could evaluate it."

ASUN plans to have copies of the newsletter in time for their open house meeting with the NU Board of Regents, vice-chancellors and other administrators this afternoon, Rogers said.


She also said she and Sen. Mike Geiger have been appointed to one of the chancellor's committees to study the reallocation process. This committee is intended "to take in information and provide information," Rogers said.

"We'll meet strictly as an advisory committee . . . and give our results to the chancellor."

An opening for a senator from the College of Business Administration was also announced.
