

Husker victim heads Bottom 10

THE COLLEGES

At one point two Saturdays ago, ABC's college scoreboard flashed the final score of Michigan's shut-out of Northwestern this way: "Michigan 35."

Northwestern's name wasn't even mentioned. Now, that's a non-entity.

But Saturday, even the Mildcats were too much for the Minnesota Gophers, who chalked up an 8-19 defeat to assume the Bottom 10 lead. Giving up 19 points to Northwestern, which has been white-

washed four times, is comparable to giving up 84 points to Nebraska (which Minnehaha also has done).

No. 6 USC, meanwhile, fell 6-27 to Notre Dame, which had almost as many wardrobe changes as Joan Rivers. The Trojans have fallen so low that there was a rumor for a while last week that ex-Oklahoma running back Marcus Dupree would transfer to USC because he wanted to attend a school that was de-emphasizing football.
