

Spikers net Big Eight win

Despite a good effort by an overmatched Kansas team, the Nebraska volleyball team recorded its 10th conference victory with a 15-2, 15-6, 15-4 sweep of the Jayhawks Saturday at the Coliseum.

By virtue of its first-place finish in league competition, the undefeated Huskers will get a first-round bye in the Big Eight tournament, which begins Friday in Ames, Iowa. Nebraska will play Saturday at 11 a.m. against a winner from Friday's competition. The championship match is scheduled for 8 p.m. Saturday night at Beyer Hall gymnasium.

Julie Hermann, Karen Dahlgren, Cathy Noth and Erin Dean had 10 kills each in Nebraska's victory against Kansas, who entered the match winless in the conference.

"I thought we played well," Nebraska coach Terry Pettit said. "I thought we did a good job of keeping our intensity up. We played much better today than we did against Iowa State (Wednesday night)."

Kansas got as close as 4-2 in the first set before Noth recorded a kill for a point, which she followed with an ace serve. The Huskers proceeded to close out the set with 11 straight points, interrupted only by three Jayhawk side-outs.

Kansas played Nebraska tougher in the second

set, getting as close as 7-5 after the Huskers had taken a 4-0 lead. But, once again, a Noth kill opened a floodgate of Husker points to seal that set. The third set was never in doubt, as Dahlgren had two blocks in the early part of it, and a kill off a short set for the third point.

For Kansas coach Bob Lockwood, the best thing that came out of the match was that his team was still physically healthy.

"As powerful as Nebraska is, they didn't hurt us," he said. "Nobody was injured."

Lockwood said Nebraska may have put together the best team ever assembled at one time in the conference, while his team was still young.

"Nebraska was so much taller than us at the net that we couldn't hope to block very many," he said. "We just had to scramble for the ball in the backcourt. What I was looking for in this match was if we gave up and just let them take it. We didn't do that, they (Kansas) hung in as best they could, and I was glad to see that."

Leslie Loyd and Julie Ester lead Kansas with six kills each. Noth had three service aces for Nebraska, which also recorded 17 blocks as a team, compared to three for Kansas.
