

Outside financial support given to UNL through October totaled approximately \$7 million compared with a little less than \$6.5 million contributed through October 1982, said Earl Freise, assistant vice chancellor for research at UNL.

Freise said he expects about \$30 million from outside funding sources for fiscal 1983-84, compared with \$26 million received in fiscal 1982-83.

Federal agencies, including the Department of Education, Health and Human Services, Energy, Agriculture and the National Science Foundation give the most support. Occasionally, NASA and the Department of Defense contribute funds also. In August, approximately half of the \$15 million received from outside sources came from federal agencies. The other research project funding came from state agencies, the University of Nebraska Foundation, industry, private foundations and

Of the \$1.5 million received in August, \$1.3 million, or 90 percent, went to research programs, Freise

said. UNL faculty members write proposals to sponsors to request this research money and money requested through October totaled more than \$10 million. Freise said the total number of grants received each year has remained constant at 2,500 during the last few years.

The other 10 percent of the August contributions went to public service programs, instructional programs and student aid, Freise said.

The amount of money received each month usually fluctuates insignificantly throughout the year, he said. The only exception is April or May, when student aid funding is received.

Freise said UNL usually ranks in the top half of the Big Eight schools in dollar amounts received from outside sources. In 1981, UNL ranked fourth in academic science/engineering research and devel-opment funds received, he said.

UNL does not expect cutbacks in outside funding in the near future, Freise said. To the contrary, some of the money cut back during the early years of the Reagan administration is being restored, he said, and cuts are not expected next year because it is an

UNL hopes to maintain the same level of funding next year with an increase to offset inflation, he
