Swimming teams face semester's biggest test

For the Nebraska men's and women's swimming teams, it's time to find out if all their hard work and effort has paid off.

Both teams will compete Friday and Saturday in the Southern Illinois Invitational, the big meet of the semester.

"Our whole season to this point has been with this meet in mind," men's coach Cal Bentz said.

The invitational also will feature the host team, Southern Illinois, Florida State, South Carolina, Miami of Ohio and Indiana.

"This will really be a strong lineup of teams," women's coach Ray Huppert said. "I think some of the times that will be posted will be the best in the nation to this point."

The women's opposition looks particularly tough. Kansas finished seventh in the NCAA meet last year, and Southern Illinois, Florida State and South Carolina were all in the top 20. Indiana and Miami of Ohio will not field men's teams at the invitational, but Bentz said the competition should be stiff. Southern Illinois was the national independent champion last year and finished 10th at the NCAA meet. Florida State and South Carolina finished in the top five at the national independent championships and Kansas was runner-up to Nebraska for the Big Eight crown.

Both Bentz and Huppert agreed that the meet's main purpose is to qualify swimmers for the NCAA championships in March.

"If we could finish in the top three," Huppert said, "we'd be really happy, because it would mean we qualified a lot of swimmers."

Bentz said the competition at the invitational should improve the Huskers' times.

"We expect the times to be a lot faster than they have been," Bentz said. "It should give us a good chance to see where we are."

Huppert said the meet has all the necessary components to lead to fast times.

"They have a great pool at Southern Illinois and the competition will be really strong," Huppert said. "Those are the main two ingredients in getting our kids pumped up so they can make their qualifying times."
