Students dance for charitable cause

For 24 hours, from Friday afternoon to Saturday afternoon, a group of students from the Harper-Schramm-Smith residence hall complex isolated themselves from every aspect of university life. Every aspect except music, that is.

Several stout-hearted students danced the night away at the Nebraska Union as part of a day-long dance-a-thon to raise money for Lincoln's Malone Community Center. Each hour they stayed on their feet meant more money for the center.

Parking procedures topic of Tuesday forum

Forum topics include: safety considerations in parking areas, parking enforcement procedures and the income and expenditures involved in maintaining UNL parking lots. The Parking Advisory Committee and the parking appeals process will be explained, and the forum will conclude with a question and answer session.

The RHA encourages students concerned or interested in UNL parking to attend the forum and present questions during the discussion.
