Parking procedures

The UNL Residence Hall Association is giving students the opportunity to ask questions about the UNL parking situation at a public forum Tuesday at 2:30 p.m. in the Nebraska Union.

Doug Stoehr, a UNL studen: who coordinated the forum, said the main speakers scheduled are campus police officers Lt. John Burke, head of the UNL Parking Advisory Committee, and Sgt. Richard Gammel, an assistant on the committee. As members of the advisory committee, the two work directly with parking regulations and improvements that affect students and thus, should be helpful in answering questions, Stoehr said.

Forum topics include: safety considerations in parking areas, parking enforcement procedures and the income and expenditures involved in maintaining UNL parking lots. The Parking Advisory Committee and the parking appeals process will be explained, and the forum will conclude with a question and answer session.
