Her portrayal of the seedy, disgusting, perverse, filthy, lewd, crude, loud-mouthed vamp was so delightful that I could not help bursting out in laughter every time she uttered a word. It's rather sad to see her get deep-sixed by the infinitely less colorful Locke, who

apparently can get no work other than in an Eastwood film.

Eastwood's name has never been synonymous with tact or subtlety, but *Sudden Impact* was so condescending and insipid that it may outdo some of Eastwood's other classics in the ranks of bad taste.
