The first event of the certs are not frequent. 1984 Kimball Performing Arts Series will be a concerted effort by violinist Daniel Heifetz with pianist Samuel Sander on Friday, Feb. 10 at 8 p.m.

The program will consist of works by Kreisler, Ives, Prokofieff, Beethoven, Tchaikovsky and Ravel. Heifetz tries to perform as often as possible in areas where classical con-

His sense of social commitment led Heifetz to donate his prize money from the prestigious Tchaikovsky Competition in Moscow to the family of Alexander Ginzberg, Soviet Jewish dissident. He has also won world-renown as a master of "chiaroscuro in sound"


