### 'Evening's' parts better than sum

One of the most serious pitfalls a director faces in constructing a musical or theatrical experience is making the production more than the sum of its parts. Unfortunately, Gregg Tallman, UNL's associate professor of opera theater, was unable to make his hour-long production of *An Evening in Paris* transcend the status of a faculty-student recital.

In theory, Sunday afternoon's performance should have been an exciting, innovative one which could have set the stage for future experiments in UNL music and theater. Considered individually, the concepts were sound but the ambiguity of the whole defeated them.

The performance took place in the auditorium of the Sheldon Memorial Art Gallery, which provided a space more intimate than Kimball Recital Hall and less grim and spartan than Westbrook's recital room. The mixture of comic and tragic, solo and multi-voice pieces complemented the informal mood. Tallman's explanatory narration between selections was a valuable addition, and was neither too complex not too simplistic for the very diverse audience in attendance.

Several superior voices highlighted the "evening." Judy Cole Shannon, associate professor of voice, sang a selection from Jules Massenet's *Werther*. Her expressive features and mezzo-soprano voice rich with emotion emphasized the desperation of the lovelorn aria.

Following Shannon, Kelly Ellenwood, Jeanne Baker and Brian Leeper engaged in some broad comedy and boisterous duets, solos and trios in their scene from Gaetano Bonizetti's La Fille du Regiment. Besides Besides her surprisingly powerful soprano voice, Ellenwood's chief attribute continues to be an overwhelming stage presence and ability to rivet the audience's complete attention.

In spite of a few giggles of recognition from the audience, the traditional "Toreador Song" from Georges Bizet's *Carmen* was performed with a strength and confidence not seen often in young baritones. Greg Berg's clear enunciation, perfectly rolled "rrrs" and emotional phrasing made the entire concert worthwhile. Berg was last year's Metropolitan Opera Auditions winner.

An Evening in Paris suffered not from lack of talent, but simply from lack of definite purpose.

Opera's distinguishing characteristic is its grand scale of production. With minimal sets, one piano, makeshift costumes and very little room in which action could take place, the Parisian evening was doomed to failure as an operatic performance, but its selection of scenes and attempted staging were equally inappropriate for an informal recital.



Another monumental blunder in *Hot Dog* is the presence of former Playboy Playmate Shannon Tweed. Tweed woodenly portrays Sylvia, a ski circuit grouple. In a performance amazingly similar to Christie Brinkley's in *Vacation*, Tweed seems much more enthusiastic about taking her clothes off than she does about saying her lines.

This film is bad, but there are some bright spots. As mentioned before, the skiing scenes are excellent. One can say that as an actor, Houser is a great skier.
