# 14th Olympics opens

SARAJEVO, Yugoslavia - The eternal Olympic flame was borne to the top of Kosevo Stadium by a white-clad Yugoslav figure skating champion Wednesday to herald the opening of the 14th Winter Games.

Yugoslav President Mika Spiljak declared the Games formally open, crowning six years of planning and building by Yugoslavs for the staging of the biggest sports event ever held in this Communist country.

The packed, 45,000-seat stadium, set against a back-



drop of snow-capped mountains, reveled in the warmth and spectacle of the opening ceremony.

The high point came when the Olympic torch, lit on Mount Olympus three weeks ago, was brought into the arena by cross-country skiers after a relay journey across Yugoslavia.

International Olympic Committee President Juan Antonio Samaranch, presiding over his first games since taking office in 1980, wished the participants luck and, speaking in Serbo-Croat, said, "Thank you, Yugoslavia - thank you, Sarajevo."

Hundreds of colored balloons were released into the air, and after the fiveringed Olympic flag had been raised, 1,800 young Yugoslavs in multicolored snowsuits treated the crowd to a dazzling display of dance and folklore.

An overnight snowfall gave Sarajevo a white coat, but by the time of the ceremony the snow had all but melted
