Nebraska wins on the road again

Nebraska's men's basketball team may have found a new home: Playing on the road.

With Saturday's 61-56 overtime upset against Missouri at Columbia, the Huskers raised their conference record to 4-4, with three of those victories on the road.

While most basketball teams fare better in their own arenas because of partial crowds and sometimes impartial referees, Nebraska Coach Moe Iba and players Eric Williams and Dave Hoppen said the home crowd has had just the opposite effect.

"We're not playing loose and we're letting the fans bother us," Iba said. Williams agreed.

"We put pressure on ourselves when we play in front of people we know," Williams said. "We're kind of uneasy at home; we're not supposed to get beat."

Hoppen said visiting teams feel no pressure because they aren't supposed to win. Nebraska must learn to feel that way when playing at home, he said.

"We're just going to have to play loose and not worry about what the people say," he said.

"If the people in Lincoln would get off our asses, we could play good basketball at home," Iba said.

Huskers gamble

Nebraska surprised Missouri players and basketball fans when it began the game in a 2-3 zone defense and stuck with it.

Because Nebraska was having a hard time matching up defensively, Iba said he decided to gam-

Missouri forward Malcolm over. Thomas, the Tigers built an eight-point lead with 5:57 remaining.

Nebraska used its own offensive weapons to fight back and eventually posted a 28-26 lead at the end of the half on Williams' layup with:01 remaining.

opened it up for me." Hoppen, who scored a game-high 24 points, said he also enjoyed not getting so tired because of career-high 18 points.


