ABSENTEE AND DISABLED BALLOTS

ABSENTEE BALLOTS. Students who will not be in Lincoln, Nebraska during the time the polls are open because they are on officially recognized university trips or have an emergency that prevents the voter from participating, may, by stating the official function on Form N supplied by the ASUN secretary and having their signature notarized by 4:00 p.m. on Friday, February 24, 1984, be permitted to vote by absentee ballot.
