Dance tour includes Kimball stop

Alvin Ailey

The Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater is celebrating its 25th aniversary with a 22-city American tour which includes a return engagement at Kimball Hall, 8 p.m. March 5 through 7. Their performances are part of the **Kimball Performing Arts Series.**

The 25th anniversary tour will feature premieres, revivals and classic works from the Ailey repertory. Programs vary each night. Monday's schedule includes "Night Creature," "Tread-ing," "Rainbow 'Round My Shoulder" and "Revelations." On Tuesday, "Isba," "Love Songs," "Night Shade" and "The Stack Up" will be featured. "Suite Otis," "Treading," "Songs Without Words" and "Revelations" wind up the schedule Wednesday.

Since the Ailey Company's debut in 1958, the company has performed for an estimated 10 million people in 43 states and 44 countries. The U.S. State Department has sponsored the company on 15 foreign tours, including a six-city tour of the Soviet Union. That marked the first time a contemporary American dance company performed in the Soviet Union since Isadora Duncan.
