Late basket defeats Nebraska

Kathy Schulz's last-second basket gave Oklahoma State a come-from-behind 84-82 victory over Nebraska Tuesday night in the first round of the Big Eight women's basketball tournament at Stillwater, Okla.
Schulz grabbed an errant 25-foot shot by Vicki Johnson and her lay-in beat the buzzer as the Cowgirls ended Nebraska's season at 16-12.
Nebraska led the entire first-half and held a 38-35 lead at intermission. Oklahoma State rallied for a 56-all tie on two Schulz free throws, then outscored the Huskers 9-2 in the next three minutes.

Cathy Owen's three-point play brought Nebraska to within two points, 75-73, with 4:09 left.
Nebraska trailed 79-75 with 2:53 left before Kelli Benson scored on a three-point play, then her jumper with 2:10 left gave Nebraska its final lead, 80-79.
Rae Rippetoe's 15-footer put Oklahoma State in front, 81-80, and she padded the lead with a free throw with 30 seconds left.
Oklahoma State's Jackie Glossen led all scorers with 31 points. Schulz scored 16 and Johnson 14.
Debra Powell's 20 points led four Nebraska starters in double figures. Owen finished with 17 points, Angie Miller added 11 and Stacy Imming 10.

Allen hopes recruits help rebuild

Although he's not counting out this year's team, Husker gymnastics Coach Francis Allen is looking ahead to next season and three recruits he hopes will sign at Nebraska.

At least two of those recruits will be here for the UCLA-Nebraska dual this Sunday night and Allen hopes they'll be ready to sign after viewing the Huskers in action.

Brian Ginsberg of Chicago is Allen's top prospect. Competing for a club there, Ginsberg won the junior meet last year, Allen said, and is considered the best in the country right now.

His greatest strength is tumbling, Allen said, which makes him a better floor exercise man than Nebraska's ever had.

Ginsberg is also talented on rings and horse, Allen said, but is a little weak on parallel bars.

"He's a fantastic athlete, though — it'd be nothing to make him a good p-bars man," he said.

Ginsberg was here during the Japanese meet in December, Allen said, and is strongly considering Nebraska.

Secondly, Allen is looking at Kevin Davis of the Atlanta School of Gymnastics to add to Nebraska's all-arounder ranks.

Davis, excellent on the pommel horse and high bar, is also considering UCLA and Arizona State, Allen said.

"His parents really want him to go here, though," he said. "They've been here before and were really impressed. There'd be no doubt if it was up to them."

Finally, Allen's third prospect is Mike Eperson of Bartlesville, Okla., who also is looking at UCLA and Arizona State in addition to Nebraska.

This year was one of the weaker recruiting seasons for the Huskers, with only one newcomer, Neil Palmer, signed to a scholarship.

Walk-ons Eric Lambert and John Chmelka, however, have both proven valuable assets to overall team performance, Allen said.

The walk-on system here needs to be improved, he said, so high school gymnasts won't be so intimidated that they don't try out for the team.
