Housed in a twostory Colonial-style building northeast of Cincinnation Interstate 71 , the hall recognizes football greats of the past. The Time Tunnel" traces football's evolution through the past 3,000 years.
The exhibit's winding path is lined up with sketches, dioramas, photographs and displays.
Many of the halls inductees are spotlighted, including Pudge Heffinger of Yale, Amos Alonzo Stagg of Chicago, John Heismann of Georgia Tech and Doc Blanchard and Glenn Davis of Army.
Replicas of a student's dorm rooms in the 1890 s , with beer steins and hurricane lamps, and in the 1940s, with pinups and movie posters add unexpected flavor to the exhibit.
Upstairs, the Outland, Lombardi and MacArthur Bowl trophies are displayed in the entry hall.
Detracting from the hall's prestige, however, is the "Flip of the Coin" game room, featuring the latest in video arcade games. Ironically, it failed to have the popular four-player football on game found in Lincoln arcades. On the museum grounds are a 20,000 seat stadium that is used for the NCAA's Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl each December and a "Walk of Champions", with outstanding high school teams and coaches recognized by concrete plaques.
The museum is open $10 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. to 5 adults.
