

Students with Hart bid for ad hoc status fails

In its last meeting, the 1983 ASUN Senate Wednesday night did not grant ad hoc status to the Students with Hart group because a quorum was lost when a senator left the meeting.

Kay Hinn, ASUN first vice president, said the group used Nebraska Union facilities before it had ad hoc status.

ASUN Organic Act 11 determines the rules to form an ad hoc group. The act states that groups "must receive majority approval of the Senate. Upon approval, the group is permitted use of university facilities for programs through proper event."

ASUN adviser Marlene Beyke said that the group filed with the CAP office for permission to use union space, but the form did not get to ASUN until recently.

Mark Scudder, ASUN president-elect, announced that sophomore Tim Brogan won the recent runoff election for

the Criminal Justice senator.

ASUN President Matt Wallace said that in the next month ASUN will work to change the basketball ticket policy to allow students better access to tickets closer to the floor.

Andy Carothers, arts and sciences, said action on a night towing ad hoc committee would be delayed until the new senators are in office.

Carothers said replacing night towing with a policy of pulling grades would require provisions to handle the increased paperwork.

The rally features Saul Antonio Solorzano, a refugee forced to flee El Salvador in 1980 because of threats from military "death squads," David Moroga, a Nicaraguan currently attending UNL and a host of other speakers.

The march will begin at 11 a.m. at the Federal Building, with the rally starting at noon on the 15th Street Mall.

Aldrich encouraged all interested people to attend the march and rally and said Central American Week has thus far been a success.

"We've seen a lot of new faces along with the old ones. Hopefully, our efforts have increased people's awareness of the problems Central America faces," she said.
