The UNL Division of Continuing Studies is again offering a program of Summer Reading credit courses which are listed below. To participate in the Summer Reading Program, attend the spring meetings of the courses in which you are interested. Register now for the course(s) you wish to study during the summer. You will then complete the course work in September by fulfilling the requirements specified by your instructor (meetings, conferences, papers, tests, etc.). Grades will be recorded in October.

Information for Students: Procedures — Rules — Dates — Deadlines

SPRING MEETINGS -

(Attendance is essential for maximum understanding of course objectives)

- attend several different course meetings to be informed of a variety of opportunities
- "permit to register" card will be issued by some instructors when attendance at a spring meeting is mandatory
- enrollment in each course will be limited

GUIDELINES FOR APPROVAL

- Approval: Discuss your course selection with your advisor so you will be sure it fits into your degree program. For example: Arts and Sciences students have a limit of 30 hours of Summer Reading Course and correspondence hours that will apply toward a degree. Architecture students need written approval to register for a Summer Reading Course. Therefore, you need to check with your college's requirements before registering for a Summer Reading Course.
- Maximum of Two only two reading courses can be taken in one summer. Any exception will require the written approval of your advisor and/or the dean of your college.

Closes at 5:00 p.m., Friday, May 11
Late Registration: with written permission of the instructor (and payment of a \$10.00 late fee) is possible until Wednesday, June 13, 1984. No SRC registrations will be possible after that date.

Cost: Full payment of Tultion is Required at Time of Registration Tuition: \$38.50 per credit hour

Books: Course Materials — Be sure to obtain all needed books and supplies in May. Bookstores will carry the required materials under the summer reading course number so look for a SRC "x" designation.

GRADING RESTRICTIONS

Grades of "W" and "I": There will be no grades of "W" or "I" given for

SRC "x" classes. The course must be completed and graded by October 12, 1984, if you are to get credit for your 1984 Summer Reading Courses. There will be no option to extend this deadline or reinstate your enrollment after this October 12, 1984, deadline.

Pass/No Pass:You must mark the registration form "P/N" for each course taken under this option. Regular P/N rules of your college will apply. Some courses have specific P/N restrictions. Final date to change to or from P/N is July 27.

GRADE REPORTING

- Completion Dates: Required work should be completed by the deadline established by your instructor.
- Final Fall contact with instructors will occur in September (nature of
- this contact will vary depending on the course).

 Grades will be recorded by instructors on October 12, 1984.
- If work is not completed and no drop is processed by the August 31 deadline, a grade of "F" will be recorded.
- ***Process all changes in SRC registrations at the Registration Office of the Division of Continuing Studies (271 Nebraska Center for Continuing Education, 33rd and Holdrege, 68583-0900).

REFUND SCHEDULE

(1) Full Refund -

if the Drop notification is filed in person or by letter at the Division of Continuing Studies before 4:30 p.m., Wednesday, June 13, 1984 (\$10.00 Administrative Fee Charged)

(2) 75% Refund —

will be given if the **Drop** notification is filed in person or by letter at the Division of Continuing Studies between June 14-July 11, 1984 (\$10.00 Administrative Fee Charged)

(3) 50% Refund -

will be given if the **Drop** notification is filed in person or by letter at the Division of Continuing Studies between July 12-August 1, 1984. (\$10.00 Administrative Fee Charged)

(4) No Refund -

there will be no refund if the **Drop** notification is filed in person or by letter at the Division of Continuing Studies after Wednesday, August 1, 1984.

DROP PROCEDURES

- May be filed IN PERSON AT, OR BY LETTER TO, the Division of Continuing Studies Registration Office (#271 Nebraska Center for Continuing Education, 33rd and Holdrege 68583-0900).
- Must be processed through the Division of Continuing Studies before Aug. 1, 1984 if any refund is to be issued.
- Must be filed by August 31, 1984, if student does not intend to submit materials to his/her instructor to meet the fall grading deadlines.

In Residence Requirement: Courses with an "x" suffix do not qualify as resident credit and therefore SRC hours will not count toward the requirement that "at least 30 of the last 36 hours of credit needed for the degree must be registered for and completed in residence."
