

UNL baseball facility improved by donation

Seven years ago, before John Sanders became head coach of the Nebraska baseball team, the Huskers had only a baseball field and two wooden benches.

Now, after a \$250,000 donation from Otto and Gladys Baumann, facilities at Nebraska resemble a major league ball park.

The donation paid for a clubhouse, the Otto and Gladys Baumann Building. Other funding paid for grandstands, a scoreboard, astroturf, video equipment and dugouts over the two wooden benches.

Sanders said he and his players have worked to raise some of the funds. He said the Jim Beltzer family of Grand Island and the Bob Flory family of Fremont both "helped tremendously." Athletic Director Bob Devaney and the Board of Regents "backed all of our moves," Sander said. He said the Home Run Club and the baseball booster club also helped.

Floyd Colon, president of the Home Run Club, said

the club formed two years ago and is just now getting involved with fundraising in the forms of membership drives and souvenir sales.

Colon said the upsurge in baseball facilities is the result of the efforts of many people working together.

Sanders said the clubhouse, the most recent addition to the baseball program, is among the nicest in the country.

"We don't take a back seat to anybody," he said. "It's a tremendous addition. It gives our players a sense of pride, a sense of identity. It's a place to call home." He said the clubhouse helps with recruiting.

In addition to home and visiting team locker rooms, the Baumann building houses the baseball coaches' offices, a conference room, and a small training room.

Athletic Director Bob Devaney said Sanders was instrumental in the recent acquisitions of the baseball program, particularly the funding for the Baumann Building. "John has done a fine job," Devaney

said. "He has worked very hard. He has created a lot of interest in baseball."

Devaney said "the interest that the Baumanns have shown in the entire athletic program" was also a factor in the \$250,000 donation.

Video Coordinator John MacKnight tapes all home and away games and some practices. Each home game is broadcast live in the conference room and the home locker room. Players and members of the Home Run Club can view the game inside during cold weather.

MacKnight said the tapes of games and practices help players with technique and form in hitting, fielding and pitching. He said tapes of opposing teams from the previous year's games give players and coaches a kind of scouting report. Pitchers can see tapes of opposing hitters, and vice versa, MacKnight said.

The video equipment also serves as a recruiting tool, MacKnight said.
