

Aid to students a record \$2.68 million

A record \$2.68 million in scholarships and fellowships will be available to UNL students this year, vice president of the NU Foundation has reported.

Ed Hirsch said the Foundation, which relies wholly on donations, collected a record \$2,686,413 to distribute to students on the three Nebraska campuses — an increase of about \$380,000 from last year.

UNL received about \$1,935,000, at the NU Medical Center in Omaha about \$294,000 and UNO about \$71,000. The

remaining money was allocated to the Systems Committee, which distributes funds to all three campuses.

Hirsch said the Foundation has little control over the money's allocation since it must follow criteria set by the donor in most cases. The UNO Alumni Association also solicits funds for scholarships to complement those obtained through the Foundation, he said.

Of the money allocated to UNL, about \$973,000 is divided among departments. The remaining \$674,000 is awarded by the General Scholarship Com-

mittee. This committee gives awards on the basis of scholastic achievement and financial need. This too usually is within the donor guidelines, according to Chris Vaage, assistant director of Scholarships and Financial Aids at UNL.

Vaage said students with grade point averages of 2.0 or better should apply for scholarships since some guidelines are so specific that only one or two students on the campus may qualify.

For instance, one donor requires the recipient of his scholarship to be from a certain voting district. If a student with this qualification doesn't apply, the money goes to someone with a high GPA or is held over until the following year, she said.

Students must reapply for grants

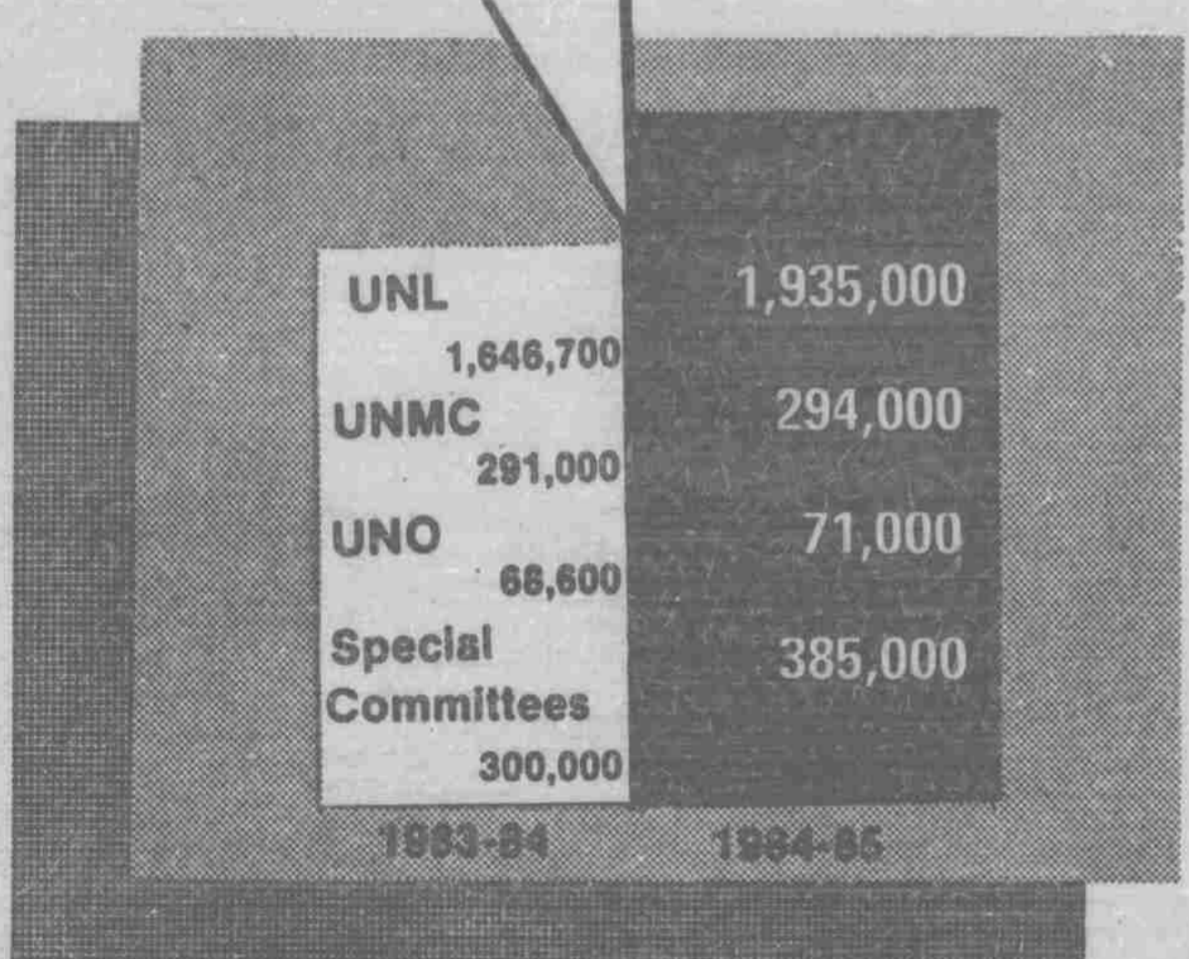
and scholarships every year or they may lose out when it comes time to pay tuition, Vaage said.

"We send out letters, print it in the student newspaper and put it on the student radio station. And every year we get students coming in wondering why they didn't get their grant. Then we at Academic Services are the 'bad guys' because we didn't tell them," she said.

Along with the need to reapply every year, Vaage said, students must make 'satisfactory progress'; that is, students must pass at least half of the classes they sign up for.

Despite this, Hirsch said, "We are providing more and more funds for the students each year as a 'thank you' from alumni for their education."
