Libraries ease search

For freshmen, the first research paper or discussion topic assignment often results in a bewildering hunt for information. To help ease the search students should know about Lincoln's libraries.

UNL's Love Library, the university's main library, is on City Campus between the College of Business Administration and Teachers College. The library has most of the university's literature pertaining to undergraduates and the humanities, Dean Waddel, assistant dean of libraries, said. The library also has more than one million books, periodicals, documents, microforms, maps and charts.

Some of the specialized material that Love Library contains

includes U.S. government documents, United Nations documents, special collections and student theses. All of UNL's library materials — even those in branch libraries — are listed in Love Library's card catalogs. Special branch library catalogs also are kept.

Branch libraries contain specialized material. For example, patent information is available in the engineering library and taped recordings and audio equipment is available in the music

UNL has several branch libraries. City campus branch libraries are: architecture, biological sciences, chemistry, engineering, geology, mathematics and physics. East campus branch libraries are dentistry and C.Y. Thompson, that contains material on agriculture, home economics and special education.

Two special library services are interlibrary loans and computer searching. Interlibrary loans help students obtain library material that UNL does not have by borrowing from other libraries. Computer searches allow students to use a computer to find references for various topics.

Ifstudents need reference materials that already are checked out at Love Library, the Lincoln city libraries may be able to help. Besides having many of the same types of services and materials that university libraries have, the Bennett Martin Public Library — Lincoln's main library at 14th and N streets — has specialties such as art slides, large print books for visually impaired people and a bookmobile, said Joyce Coppinger of the Lincoln city libraries.
