Intramural program revises sportsmanship rating system

A new flag football rule and a revised sportsmanship rating system will greet intramural enthusiasts when team sports begin play Sept. 10.

Kenda Scheele, director of intramurals, also said the checkout process for athletic equipment has been revised for quicker service. The Campus Recreational Sports Festival has been rescheduled to avoid conflicts with Labor Day vacations and several open recreational sites,

such as East Campus and the Coliseum weightroom, will have a new look this semester.

The program also has added two graduate students to assist the four full-time staff members. New programs, such as adult tennis and swimming lessons and in-state competitions for intramural champions also are in the works.

The services will be added at no increased cost in entry or student fees for the participants.


The UNL Office of Campus Recreation, 1740 Vine St., offers 85 student intramural activities, some of which are combined efforts with the Nebraska Union Recreation program. The office also offers outdoor recreation programs that include basic rock climbing trips, canoe trips, a 100-mile bicycle tour, and skiing trips. Sports equipment ranging from outdoor items such as canoes, tents and sleeping bags to bicycles, golf clubs, basket-balls, volleyballs and nets can be rented from the office.


The office also employs more than 250 students per year, mostly as referees for intramural contests. Stan Campbell is in his third year as director of the recreation office.
