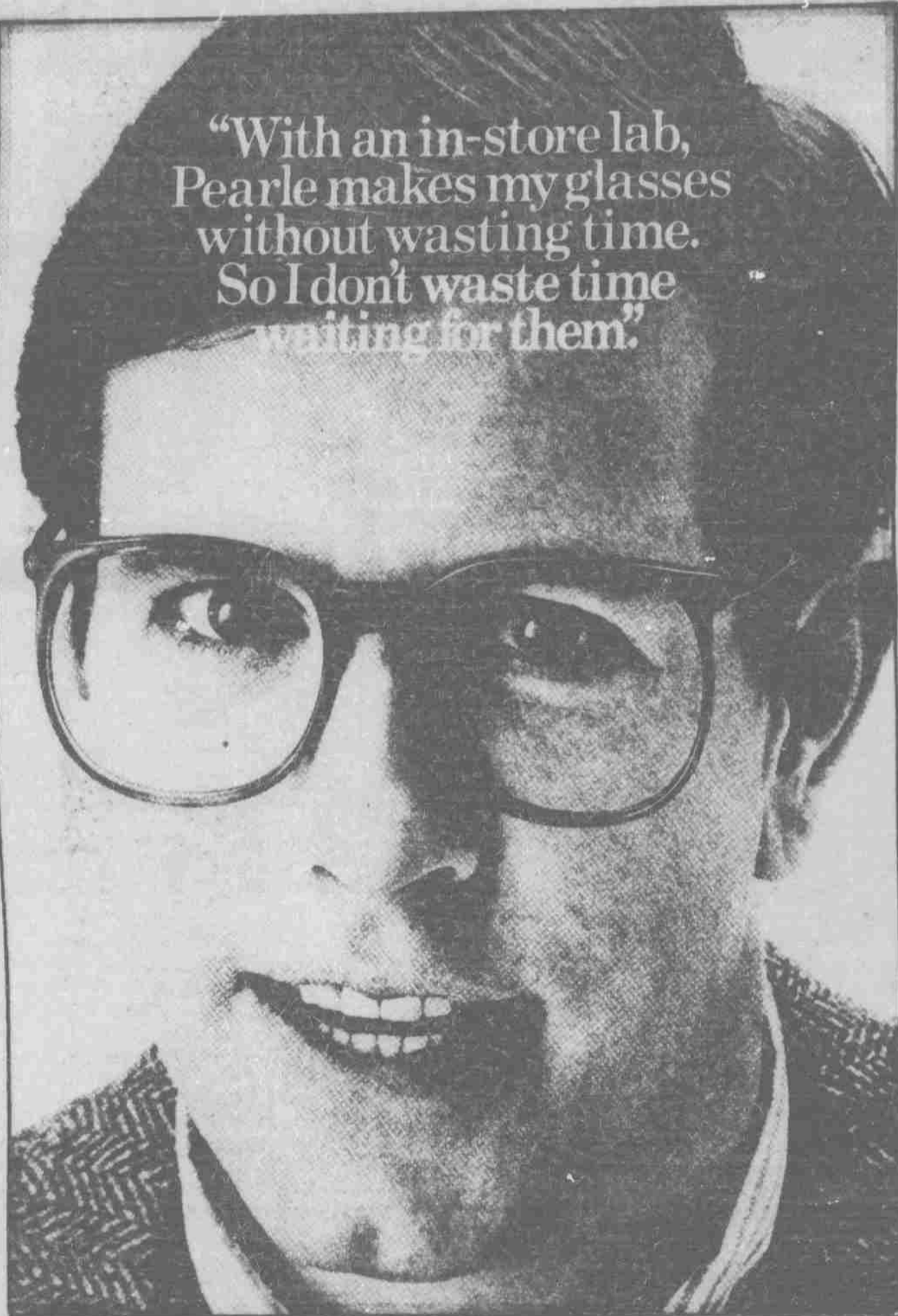

The following Lincoln Transportation System schedule and route adjustments are effective beginning today: College View route #3 (trips leaving 52nd and Claire streets start ing at 4:05 p.m.); Normal route #13: (trips arriving at 28th and South streets inbound starting at 3:21 p.m.); and Crosstown route #14: (the Crosstown route will operate only one bus) all will be adjusted. Riders can get a new schedule from their drivers. LTS fare changes beginning Saturday are as follows: Cash: adults, 65 cents; children (5-11), 40 cents; and children 4 and under, free. Punchcards: Adults (20-ride) \$13; students (20-ride, 6 a.m. — 6:15 p.m., school days only), \$8. Passports: One month of unlimited rides, \$20. Special: Elderly/handicapped (9 a.m.-3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday and all day Saturday 30 cents; Ride & Shop (10 a.m.-4 p.m.), free; handivan (after urday), 7:15 p.m.), \$1-cash only. Transfers: Regular and stop-over are free. The 50-cent mid-day fare has been eliminated. For more information call LTS at 476-1234.

Voter registration is easy and takes only a few minutes. You can register to vote at the Election Commission Office, 555 S. 10th St., Room A068 from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and Tuesday nights until 5:30 p.m. Once you have registered, you don't have to reregister unless you change your name, move or plan to change your political affiliation. Change of address cards are available at post offices or banks. To vote in the Nov. 6 election you must be registered by Oct. 26. For more information on additional registration sites call 471-7311.
