

'Refreshed' Fresno State Bulldogs push Wildcats to Bottom Ten lead

THE COLLEGES Poor Arizona was playing host to a school - Fresno State whose city was recently ranked 227th and last in the nation in livability by a New York geography professor. The normally gasping



Bulldogs were evidently so refreshed by the clear air in Tucson Saturday that they whipped Arizona 22-27 to dump the Wildcats into the Bottom Ten lead.

No. 2 Stanford, which has not completed band tryouts, was idle. No. 3 University of Texas at El Intercepted Paso, chosen to throw out the first shoulder of the season, succumbed to Texas A&M 17-20.

Meanwhile, Minnehaha moved from No. 2 to No. 11 after an impressive week of practice by Coach Lou Holtz, who got off several good one-liners.

Saturday was a mixed day for universities named after great Americans, with losses suffered by Washington State, Lincoln and James Madison only partly offset by a victory by Murray State (named after the great disc jockey Murray the K).
