Bulldogs were evidently so refreshed by the clear air in Tucson Saturday that they whipped Arizona 22-27 to dump the Wildcats into the Bottom Ten lead.

No. 2 Stanford, which has not completed band tryouts, was idle. No. 3 University of Texas at El Interceptor Paso, chosen to throw out the first shoulder of the season, succumbed to Texas A&M 17-20.

Meanwhile, Minnehaha moved from No. 2 to No. 11 after an impressive week of practice by Coach Lou Holtz, who got off several good one-liners.

Saturday was a mixed day for universities named after great Americans, with losses suffered by Washington State, Lincoln and James Madison only partly offset by a victory by Murray State (named after the great disc jockey Murray the K).

Former UNL volleyball manager leads improving Iowa team

A week after its opening season straight-set win against Wichita State, the UNL volleyball team takes on Iowa University Saturday in Iowa City.

Iowa finished 22-9 last year and tied for third in the Big Ten. Third-year Iowa Coach Sandy Stewart said she is happy with her team's two-year turnaround.

"We were 9-22 my first year and 22-9 last year," Stewart said. "With five starters returning from last year's team, we should continue to improve."

Stewart graduated in 1977 from UNL, where she was manager for the volleyball team. She then coached at Norris High School before going on to college coaching.

The Hawkeyes defeated St. Ambrose State in their first game

this season, but Stewart seems apprehensive.

Besides Nebraska, Stewart singled out perennial Big Ten powerhouse Northwestern as the team her squad wants to beat.

"If we are going to be contenders for the Big Ten championship, we need to beat Northwestern," Stewart said. "Beating Northwestern and making it to the NCAA playoffs are our two main goals."

Stewart said she is counting on sophomore Cathy Griesheim and senior Dee Ann Davidson to lead Iowa to the top. Last year, Griesheim was the Big Ten Freshman of the Year. Davidson was a second-team all-Big Ten performer.

Iowa will play rival Iowa State Saturday morning before playing Nebraska Saturday afternoon. Stewart said she will rely on steady motivation to keep her team sharp for both games.
