COLLEGE FOOTBALL SATURDAY

Nebraska (8-0) at Syracuse (2-1), 11 a.m., Katz Sports (KMTV, Channel 3, KOLN-TV, Channel 10).

Last Year: Nebraska won 63-7 in Lincoln.

What to Watch: Syracuse could have beaten Rutgers if the Orange men had not fumbled away several opportunities at the goal line. Quarterback Todd Norley and running back Jamie Convington key the Orange's offense. This is the second of four straight Nebraska games to be televised.

Illinois (3-1) at Iowa (1-2), 11 a.m., CBS (WOWT, Channel 6).

Last Year: Illinois won 33-0 in Champaign, Ill.

What to Watch: It's the Jack Trudeau and Chuck Long Show. With Heisman Trophy potentials being injured each week, these quarterbacks have moved into contention. Omahan Larry Station is an all-Big Ten linebacker for Iowa, losers of its last two games.

Texas (1-0) vs. Penn State (3-0) at Giants Stadium, 11 a.m., ESPN, Cable Channel 5.

Last Year: The teams did not play.

What to Watch: Texas has had a two-week rest since finding its offense in a 35-27 win against Auburn. Todd Dodge had no trouble finding his receivers, unlike 1983, when Texas' offense struggled. Penn State blew away

William and Mary with the aid of Doug Stang's arm.

Tennessee (2-0-1) at Auburn (1-2), 11 a.m., WTBS, Cable Channel 4).

Last Year: Auburn won 37-14 at Knoxville, Tenn.

What to Watch: Auburn's offense still hasn't completely recovered from losing Bo Jackson to a shoulder separation. Tennessee's star runner, Johnnie Jones, is alive and well and chewing up the yards for the Vols, who face their first test Saturday.

Notre Dame (2-1) at Missouri (1-2), 2:30 p.m., ABC (KETV, Channel 7).

Last Year: The teams did not play.

What to Watch: A loss could mean Missouri's Warren Powers or Notre Dame's Gerry Faust will not have a job at the end of the season. Missouri's defense has allowed more points in three games than some Tiger teams have in a season. Notre Dame is touting running back Allen Pinkett for the Heisman.

Navy vs. Arkansas at Little Rock, 6:30 p.m., ESPN, Cable Channel 5.

Last Year: The team did not play.

What to Watch: Navy's Napoleon McCullum had his chances for the Heisman dashed by a fractured ankle last week against Virginia. New Arkansas coach Ken Hatfield has settled on Brad

Taylor as quarterback and the "50" alignment for the Razorback defense.

PRO FOOTBALL SUNDAY Dallas (3-1) at Chicago (3-1), noon, CBS (WOWT, Channel 6, KOLN-TV, Channel 10).

Last Game: Dallas won 10-9 in 1981.

What to Watch: Steve Fuller may start at quarterback for the injury-plagued Bears. Walter Payton passed Franco Harris, and is 221 yards shy of Jim Brown's NFL rushing record. Dallas' interception specialist, Everson Walls, picked off two against Green Bay and was named Sports Illustrated's player of the Week.

Los Angeles Raiders (3-1) at Denver (3-1), 3 p.m., NBC (KMTV, Channel 3).

Last Game: Raiders won 22-20 in LA in 1983.

What to Watch: The Raiders rallied to defeat stubborn San Diego Monday night. Denver's 21-0 shutout of Kansas City was the Broncos' first since blanking the Raiders, then in Oakland, in 1981.

Detroit (1-3) at San Diego (2-2), 3 p.m., CBS (WOWT, Channel 6, KOLN-TV, Channel 10).

Last Game: San Diego won 28-23 in 1981.

What to Watch: The Lions perennially struggle to find a quarterback, and this year's search has caused their shaky start. San Diego's defense leaks more than the Watergate plumbing.

After trouncing Canada team, UNL volleyers go to tourney

The University of Nebraska's women's volleyball team hosted the University of Sherbrooke from Quebec, Canada, Thursday night at the Coliseum. The Huskers easily defeated Sherbrooke in three sets 15-9, 15-9, 15-3.

In the first set, Sherbrooke kept close at the beginning, leading at one time 3-5. But offensive pressure by the Huskers, particularly by Kathy Noth, helped them pull ahead and eventually win. Noth had five of her eight kills of the game in the first set.

The second set was for the most part a rerun of the first, with Sherbrooke keeping in close in the early goings and the Huskers storming back for the win.

Nebraska took total control of the third set from start to finish. Junior, Michelle Smith came off the bench to start the third set, and lead the team in blocks — four — and kills — nine.

"I felt that Smith was really setting up well on blocks. She came

off the bench in the first and second sets and played good, so I started her the third set," Pettit said.

Leading in total kills along with Smith were Annie Adamczak and Karen Dalhgren who both contributed nine kills a piece.

Pettit said he thought his team played a strong offensive game and served well, but was disappointed in their defense. "I felt we were not getting set up for our blocks and I was surprised our volleys weren't longer," Pettit said.

Leading in assists were Noth and Mary Buysse with 21 and 18 assists respectively. Buysse, Dalhgren, and Sharon Kramer each contributed two ace serves as well.

"I think we just wore them down mentally," Pettit said, "but they're a well organized team that played us close in the beginning."

Currently ranked 8th in the NCAA standings and posting an 8-0 record, the Huskers head into the Husker invitational. The invitational starts today and runs all weekend at the Coliseum.

The Huskers will be hosting the University of Sherbrooke, Southwest Missouri, and Colorado State.

Pettit said tonight's game was a good warm up for the tournament and expects good competition.

"It should be a real good tournament, but I suspect Colorado State will be our toughest opponent."
