Gloria is not real, but like one of many women nationwide, she may be suffering from an eating disorder, anorexia nervosa. The disorder is characterized by several disturbances in a person's self-perception of their body image, a misinterpretation of "hunger," and a sense of being "unable to change anything," according to the director of the Mental Health Clinic at UNL.

Karen Kelly said the physical consequences of anorexia nervosa are severe weight loss (25 percent or more), a skeleton-like appearance, dry skin, anemia, cessation of menustration and low body temperature.

Although anorexia nervosa is something we'd like to think "doesn't really happen" to us or anybody we know, the disorder can strike anyone, Kelly said. The disease is more widespread than most people realize.

What's at the bottom of the potentially fatal disorder?
