

# Huskerettes replaced by 'Iba' pom pon squad

"The Huskerettes performed just at half time during all games, and we may just be performing after every other one," said Becky Dubas, a member of Chi Omega sorority and a former Huskerette. "It is not decided yet."

"I hope that the fans as well as the student enjoy them. I think it is going to be a good idea for our program. It may not make us play better basketball, but we do hope to add to the fans' enjoyment of the game by doing this."

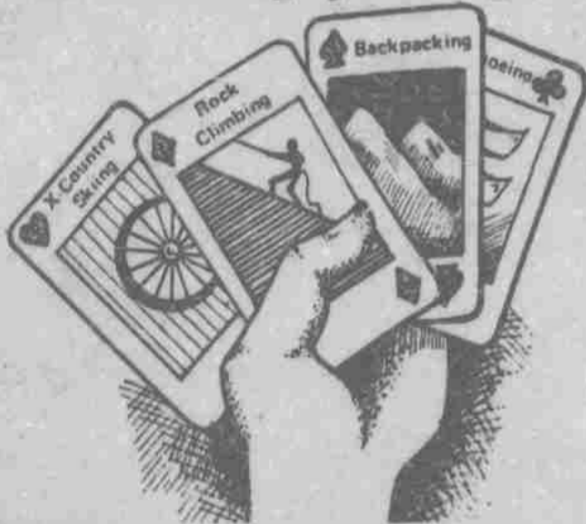

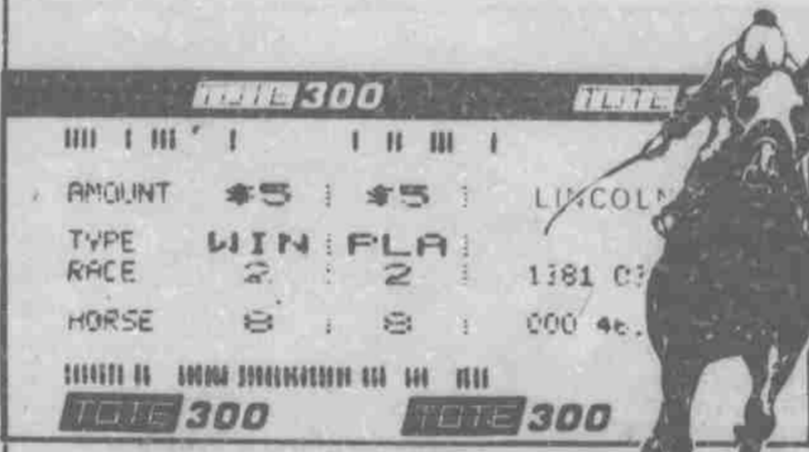
