Athletes from more than 60 countries are expected to take part in the first-ever World Indoor Games in Paris in January, International Amateur Athletic Federation Chairman Primo Nebiolo said today.

An IAAF statement issued at the federation's annual Calendar Congress said 12 men's and 10 women's track and field events would be held January 18 and 19 in the newly-built "Palais Omnisport de Paris Bercy."

The rules allow each country to enter up to two people for each event. The IAAF said it would pay accommodation and a large part of travel expenses for 300



The UNL department of art, with the support of the Nebraska Arts Council and in conjunction with the Nebraska Art Association Sheldon Memorial at Gallery will present New York artist/printmaker Clayton Pond.

Pond will visit the department of art, meeting with faculty and students on Wednesday. He also will show slides and talk about his recent work at 5:30 p.m. at the Sheldon Gallery Auditorium. Known primarily for his brightly colored screenprints, Pond does close-up details of his environment that become almost abstracted rhythms of form, line and color. A reception and opportunity to view his work will follow in the Print Study Room. The event is free.

The Nebraska Arts Council, a state agency, has supported this art event through its matching grants program funded by the Nebraska Legislature and the National Endowment for the Arts, a federal agency.

The Chestnut Brass Company, a brass quintet from Philadelphia, will perform as part of Union College's Family Entertainment Series. The concert will be at 8 p.m. Saturday in the college auditorium at 49th and Prescott streets.

The ensemble performs vintage Civil War compositions, Joplin rags and jazz arrangements.
