## Restaurant botches swimmers' plans

Nebraska women's swimming coach Ray Huppert had mixed feelings about his team's trip to Lawrence, Kan., last weekend for the Big Eight Invitational.

Huppert said he was pleased with the Huskers' second place finish to host team Kansas.

"I was happy with the way they swam," Huppert said. "It showed we have some depth to our team."

After the team returned to Lincoln on Sunday, through, he wasn't quite as happy about the meet. Food poisoning had struck the swimmers and the coaching staff.

"We took 22 swimmers down there, not including the divers, and out of the 22, 16 got sick," Huppert said. "And that's just the women's team. The men got hit just as bad."

The team ate at a restaurant in Lawrence after the meet, and that is where Huppert thinks the team was poisoned.

"It didn't hit us until we got back to Lincoln on Sunday," Huppert said.

As a result of the illness, Huppert and men's coach Cal Bentz had to decrease the intensity of their team's preparations for a dual meet with the Air Force Academy. The meet is set for 4 p.m. at the Bob Devaney Sports Center.

Huppert is unsure how the sickness will affect his squad's performance.

"It could work one of two ways," Huppert said. "Since we can't maintain the intensity in our training, the kids could be rested and swim

well. But it could drain them and they would swim tired."

The food poisoning is just one problem the Huskers will have to overcome, Huppert said.

The Air Force men's squad lands in Lincoln Friday with a solid all-around team, Bentz said.

"They have some good distance people and a great 200-meter butterfly too," Bentz said.

The Cadets will have an added advantage when they travel from Colorado Springs, Colo.

"They're coming down out of altitude and naturally, the farther you come down, the better condition you're going to be in," Bentz said.

The men's squad dominated the Big Eight Invite, winning 10 of 16 individual events and finishing 207 points ahead of second-place Iowa State. Freshman Ed Jowdy led the Husker charge, winning the 100- and 200-meter breaststroke.

Bentz said the final score wasn't

a true assessment of the meet.

"The score may indicate we won the meet by 200 points," Bentz said. "But we ran in some extra events. We scored well in some 'B' relays and if you take that into consideration, the final score really wasn't realistic."

The victory did convince Bentz of one thing: This year's squad is the best he has coached in his years at Nebraska. In order to stay there though, he said, they must continue to work hard.

"We just have to keep getting faster and faster, week after week," Bentz said. "I feel we're pretty much on the right track now, and the guys are always ready to race."

After the Air Force meet, the men travel to Texas the following weekend for dual meets with Southern Methodist and Texas Christian. The women leave Lincoln next Thursday for Colorado to compete with Colorado State and Wyoming.
