Nonetheless, The Town Cobbler supports shoe-shiner John Merrill and the Ernisse family. Terry repairs shoes, wife, Teri, works on jackets and other leathers, the children run for Mom's and Dad's tools and the dog stands watch behind the counter.

A former truck driver, Merrill said, "it keeps me off the highways at least."

"We do OK," Ernisse said. "We're well established. Part of the shop's reputation stems from its war-time service. During World War II, Ernisse said, Victor was turned down by the armed services because he was needed at home. Leather was in short supply, he said, and the government felt Victor, with his wife's help, could better serve the country as a shoe repairman.

Today, the Ernisses said they try to live up to the Koller reputation.

"Terry is good with his hands," Teri said, "and Victor is a good teacher."

But with only four years of experience — after Ernisse shocked Victor by walking into the shop and repairing his own work boot, Victor sold the shop to Ernisse for \$5,000, the same amount that Koller sold it to Victor for — and the large number of imported shoes sporting unusual structures that come into the shop, Ernisse said, mistakes do arise.

"Some things you only come cross once or twice a year," he said. "A lot of those are trial and error. This is not a trade you can learn in two or even four years."
