 Also, 24-hour access to the union during finals week and a satellite registration program which would enable students to register for classes in their adviser's office and find open classes without going through the drop/add process later. Giving ASUN executives "more specific" roles and publishing an ASUN newsletter more often and with private funding.

**THREE MOST IMPORTANT ISSUES RELATED TO STUDENTS:** Representing students and defending their rights. ASUN must deal with individual issues and concerns of students, Change says. Another issue is representation within ASUN. Change said they offer a greater diversity of candidates from all aspects of campus life. Experience and who can get the job done also is important. "There is no

replacement for experience," presidential candidate Goldstein said. The Change Party is the only party that has candidates who have served on ASUN, he said.

**ROLE OF ASUN PRESIDENT AS STUDENT REGENT:** "The student regent is the voice of the students," Goldstein said. "Even without a vote the student regent can bring up motion and amendments. You can be an active regent without voting." However, Goldstein said he does favor a student regent vote on the board.

**PROPOSALS AND CHANGES:** Target agrees with the Change Party about continuing publication of the ASUN newsletter and establishing a "Communications Task Force," which would include presidents of major organizations on campus representing diverse areas of campus.

**THREE MOST IMPORTANT ISSUES FACING STUDENT BODY:** Costs for UNL students is one of three issues Target Party president Keating said should be addressed.

Keating said tuition money should stay in the "instructional budget" instead of having so much allocated for research.

Keating also said merit-based pay is a great concern of students as is student life on campus. He said the proposed Recreation Center, which will be on Wednesday's ballot, would provide a strong recruitment for UNL.

**ROLE OF ASUN PRESIDENT AS STUDENT REGENT:** Keating dislikes the fact that although the student regent "gives more and more hours of time," he or she still is not allowed to vote.


"You need to be able to vote to be effective," he said. Keating proposes a professional lobbyist be hired by UNL in addition to a student lobbyist.

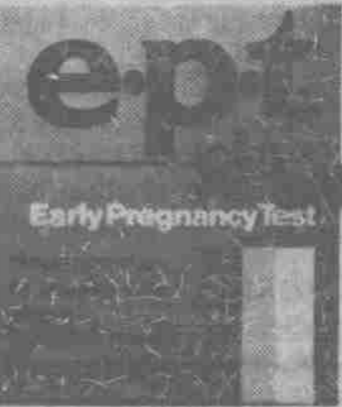



 Look candidates said they plan to do this by continuing the "senator of the month program," encouraging senator participation in other clubs and activities and unifying the residence halls by forming a residence council of representatives. Look also proposes publishing an annual off-campus survival guide and diverting more attention to minority students.

**THREE MOST IMPORTANT ISSUES FACING STUDENTS:** The issue of liberal arts education at UNL is an important aspect of student concerns, according to Look Party members.

Lock, like their opponents, emphasized stronger student involvement on campus.

"The first step is to get out and vote," Lane said. The party also strongly supports the proposed Recreation Center, but only after the students have given their opinion on it in Wednesday's election. Students will be offered a vote on the issue, to see if they are willing to support an increase in student fees to support the project.

**ROLE OF ASUN PRESIDENT AS STUDENT REGENT:** Look presidential candidate Burke said the student regent's role is to address the issues and come to a compromise between students and administrators on different issues.

 Noble said he would also like to see a "revamping or elimination" of UNL's New Student Orientation program. He said NSO is an added expense to out-of-state freshmen who cannot attend NSO seminars as a part of pre-registration.

TURD presidential candidate Jerry Beaumont, a senior textiles major, said in a Daily Nebraskan letter that ASUN is a "reasonless democracy" as is evident in the TURD acronym, "Trying to Undermine Reasonless Democracy."

Johnston said SCUM would support the consumption of alcohol on the UNL campus. Johnston said the NU Board of Regents does not abide by the university alcohol policy, a policy they set. The regents show a "double standard," he said, when they consume alcohol during football Saturday at on-campus parties. In contrast, "dorm residents of legal age are given no opportunity to possess alcohol in their place of residence," he said.

Johnston said SCUM also supports RHA in the elimination of vice-presidential salaries. Instead, he said the money should be spent on an all-university party at the end of the school year.
