Last year, 13th-ranked Missouri finished third behind Nebraska, but Tiger Coach Charles Jacobson said the Big Eight race is going to be tight. If all the teams are hitting their events, it could come down to who makes the crucial mistake, he said.

Jacobson said he has four good all-arounders in senior Lisa Hyberger, 36.65 average, sophomore Val Erickson, 36.75 and sophomore Gretchen Schmidt, who is ranked third in the conference with a 37.25.

Jacobson said the team is going for

the Big Eight title because it already has qualified for the NCAA regionals on March 30.

Iowa State and Oklahoma State are the only other schools that field women's gymnastics teams. Elstun, a sophomore is ranked fifth in the conference all-around for Oklahoma State. Iowa State has two gymnasts, Tracy Remien and Ann Lohmann, ranked in the floor exercise and one, Kathy Edwards, in the vault. The Cyclones do not have an all-arounder in the top 10.

Iowa State Assistant Coach Mike Sharples said he hopes his team can

break the 170 mark. He said the team is young, and he hoped they would "have a good time and learn from the experience of competing in a big meet."

The competition tonight and Saturday begins at 7:30. Tickets are \$2 for students and \$3 for adults. The team title will be decided tonight, while the individual titles will be decided Saturday.

Walton said he hopes to break the conference attendance record, which is near 2,000. The meet will be televised by the Sports Time cable network.

Tourney finish 'disappoints' golf coach

After a 'disappointing' finish at the New Orleans Invitational, the Nebraska men's golf team hopes to rebound next week at the Arizona Invitational and the Conquistador Invitational.

"I was not very happy with our play in New Orleans," men's golf coach Larry Romjue said. "We should have been third or fourth."

The team finished twelfth out of 18 teams. No one played well, Romjue said. It was the team's first tournament since October.

"We are at a real disadvantage being

from the north," Romjue said. "Some teams have been practicing all year."

Mike Schuchart, Bryan Hughett, and Curt Tate lead the team into the 10-team Arizona tournament in Tucson. Included in the field are third-ranked Oklahoma and host Arizona. The Conquistador tournament, also in Tucson, has 25 teams entered.

"We have an experienced team and we should be able to come back," Romjue said. "The weather this year is better than the past, but it is hard to come back quickly."
