> Individually, the works are impressive. One piece which, though not precisely American, is a study by Marcel Duchamp for his controversial painting, "Nude Descending a Staircase," which turned the American art scene on its head. Beyond its historical significance, it is a beautiful piece of art to look at.

Just as impressive is a watercolor by Winslow Homer. It shows Homer at his best, capturing the elemental forces of nature and man with a view that makes the commonplace monumental. An artist whose work is usually monumental in size, Jackson Pollock, has a small but well done work in enamel on paper.

"American Works on Paper" runs through Sunday, April 21. This show is a must for anyone who is at all interested in American art of the past century.


