

Awards ceremony scheduled

Students, faculty to be honored at convocation

UNL will have its 57th annual All-University Honors Convocation in the Bob Devaney Sports Center Friday, to recognize students and faculty members.

More than 2,000 students will be

cited for their academic performances at the convocation, including more than 300 seniors who will be cited as superior scholars for either being in the top 3 percent of their class or having been on the honor list each year since their freshman year.

UNL will present two awards for Distinguished Educational Service at the

convocation to Leslie Whipp, professor of English, and Don Miller, Lancaster County extension agent chairperson for UNL's Cooperative Extension Service.

Distinguished Educational Service Awards are presented annually to recognize outstanding performance by faculty members who perform continuing educational service other than on-campus instruction.

Whipp has taught at UNL for 25 years. Besides his regular teaching assignments, he has demonstrated a concern for improving writing skills at all educational levels. Whipp has been involved in programs such as Project English, the Tri-University program, the Training Teacher Trainers project and the Nebraska Writing Project. He also has taught writing seminars in Nebraska and has written essays on the way young children write.

Whipp earned his bachelor's and master's degrees at the University of Minnesota and his doctoral degree at UNL.

Miller has been Lancaster County extension agent chairperson since 1976. Before then he was extension agent chairman in Hall County, and from 1959 to 1970 was the extension agent in Box Butte County.

Miller has been instrumental in the

use of microcomputers for extension offices. Through his efforts, an interfacing system was developed between microcomputers and the Nebraska AGNET system. In 1984, he received the Cooperative Extension Service's Distinguished Extension Agent Award for his leadership in using microcomputers with farmers and 4-H members.

Miller earned a bachelor's degree from UNL and a master's degree from Colorado State University. The university also will present Distinguished Teaching Awards to 19 members of the UNL faculty and also will present an educational service award to a faculty member.

James McShane, professor of English, will receive the Annis Chalkin Sorenson Award for Distinguished Teaching in the humanities.

The NU Foundation Award will be presented to Erwin Goldenstein, professor of adult education and social foundations.

Two professors will receive Amoco Foundation Awards: Donald McCurdy, professor of curriculum and instruction, and Jack Schinstock, professor of agricultural engineering.

Fifteen other awards for distinguished teaching authorized by the Legislature will be presented to:

● John Rupnow, assistant professor of food science and technology.

● Robert Duncan, associate professor of architecture.

● John Brumbaugh, professor of biological sciences; Barbara DiBernard, associate professor of English; Richard Dienstbier, professor of psychology; Raymond Hagg, professor of music; Helen Moore, assistant professor of sociology; David Read, associate professor of art; and James Samson, professor of physics and astronomy.

● Robert Justis, professor of management.

● Verner Meyers, associate professor of construction management, and Yen-Ching Pao, professor of engineering mechanics.

● Rita Keane, assistant professor of textiles, clothing and design.

● Gordon Culver, professor of business education, and Thomas Wandzilak, assistant professor of health, physical education and recreation.

A reception for students, their parents, and faculty members will be at 9 a.m. at the sportscenter's track. The convocation begins at 10:30 a.m.

Roy Arnold, vice chancellor of the Institute for Agriculture and Natural Resources, will preside at the convocation.
