
> Lasting materials, such as marble and wood for the floors, were selected, White said, to keep future furnishing replacements at a minimum.

> The bookstore does not receive state money, he said. It operates like any other business. Coffey said he does not think student fees will be needed to help pay for the new bookstore. He also said the store would continue with its present pricing policies and strategies.

On Feb. 16, the NU Board of Regents approved the bookstore project, Coffey said. Construction began Feb. 18, as workers removed pool tables and the bowling alley in the recreation center to make way for the new store, he said.


