Competition for 1986-87 Fulbright Awards to Study Abroad Free!

THE PROGRAM: The Fulbright Program, administered by the U.S. Information Agency with federal funds, provides grants for study abroad for one academic year including round trip transportation, language and/or orientation courses when appropriate, tuition, books, room, and board.

THE APPLICANT: For students who are seniors during the 1985-86 academic year and will have graduated by summer 1986, and for all graduate students.

Applicants must be U.S. citizens at the time of application, have a bachelor's degree before leaving for abroad, and in most cases have a working knowledge of the language of the host country. Successful applicants generally have at least a 3.3 GPA. Candidates may not hold doctoral degrees.
