## Pitt picked to knock off Ohio State

Auburn Coach Pat Dye says it's "nice to be No. 1, but I'm more concerned with facing the No. 1 defense in gan: Michigan 20-13. the nation this weekend."

Having supplanted idle Oklahoma as the No. 1 team in the Associated Press poll this week by crushing Southwestern Louisiana 49-7, Auburn next entertains Southern Mississippi. The Golden Eagles surrendered only 138 yards in defeating Louisiana Tech 28-0

On the other hand, Auburn's Bo Jackson rushed for 290 yards and scored four touchdowns from the Tigers' new I-formation, but USM's defense figures to be a little more resistant than USL's.

Auburn is a 21-point favorite and the pick is Auburn, 34-10.
