# Vacancies not hindrance Administrator says office operates smoothly

Despite four vacant positions in the Student Affairs department, the office operation has not suffered, a department spokesman said.

Ted Pfeifer, director of registration and records, said the several staff members are assuming the responsibilities of four unfilled positions. The positions include dean of students, director of admissions and advising, assistant to the dean of students and assistant to the vice chancellor of student affairs.
