



Gymnastics triangular victory pleases coach

Men's gymnastic's coach Francis Allen had nothing but praise for the Cornhuskers following their triangular victory against Oklahoma and Iowa State on Saturday at the Bob Devaney Sports Center.

The Huskers, who hit on 80 percent of their routines, scored a 279.75 -272.85 victory against the Sooners. Iowa State finished third in the triangular with a score of 276.90.

Allen said he was very happy with the Cornhuskers' performance. Besides avenging two early season losses to the Sooners, Nebraska also scored what Allen said could be the highest team score in the country with its 279.75

Individuals who did particularly well in the meet included sophomores Kevin Davis and Tom Schlesinger and defending NCAA all-around Wes Suter, Allen
