JUNIOR HIGH TEACHER PREPARATION PROJECT
LINCOLN PUBLIC SCHOOLS/UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA—LINCOLN

A fifth year internship experience is being offered for people specifically interested in teaching in the junior high. It is part of a collaborative project between the Lincoln Public Schools and the University of Nebraska-Lincoln Teachers College. This internship is a full year's experience, combining a half-time teaching assignment in a junior high with a half-time graduate studies component. This is a unique project designed to provide support between the student teaching experience and a full-time teaching position.

The Lincoln Public Schools will pay a stipend for the three classes taught at Collier Junior High School and will provide health coverage. Nine hours of graduate credit per semester may be earned from UNL.
Students who have graduated by May, 1986, and have applied for both a teaching certificate and for admission to a graduate program are eligible to apply for an internship.
