

Club fund aids needy students

The UNL Faculty Women's club has a fund for students lacking enough money to pay for costly emergencies.

The fund was started in 1948, said Mary Burrow, chairman of the emergency fund. She said the \$800 fund is supported by donations.

She said the fund is for emergencies such as health problems, fire loss and

food needs. The fund is not for planned expenses such as tuition and books.

If a student runs into an emergency expense and would like to apply for money, applications are at the Ombudsman's office, Lyman Hall 116, and the Office of Scholarships and Financial Aid.

Burrow said the club does not like to loan out more than \$200 to an individual. But each applicant is considered on an individual basis.

For example, Burrow said an African family needed to return to Africa because of the sudden death of a family member who attended UNL. The fund aided the family in returning home.

Other examples include replacing furniture damaged by a fire or paying for food, eye glasses and dental bills.

She said the money does not have to be paid back, but the club encourages students to pay it back when they can.
