Nebraska ETV Network to show Miles Davis, NU issues programs

The music and mystique of jazz great Miles Davis is celebrated when "Great Performances" airs "Miles Ahead: The Music of Miles Davis," Sunday at 2 p.m. on Nebraska ETV.

The 60-minute performance/documentary features the master trumpeter, bandleader and innovator in concert with his current band, as well as rare archival footage from 1959 to the present and in even rarer, recent on-camera interviews.

The special program also includes interviews with some of Davis' famous sidemen such as George Benson, Herbie Hancock and Keith Jarrett. Reflections on Davis' creativity are provided by Bill Cosby, Dizzy Gillespie and Gil Evans.

Along the way in examining Davis' career over the past 40 years, "Miles Ahead" features his pioneering jazz work with the genius of Be-Bop, Charlie

"Bird" Parker, touching on their sometimes stormy relationship.

It also explores his extraordinary creative collaborations with composer/arranger Gil Evans on such classic record albums as "Sketches of Spain" and his intuitive genius as a bandleader. He sought out and nurtured the young, innovative leaders of successive generations — such as John Coltrane, Wayne Shorter and Herbie Hancock — forging their emerging talent into a continual series of new sounds and catapulting them into their own stardom.

Issues of importance to Nebraskans and how the state's University of Nebraska system affects those issues, is the focus of the returning "University Magazine" series, premiering Sunday at 7:30 p.m. over all stations of the Nebraska ETV Network.

The 30-minute weekly series, hosted by Kevin Hofeditz, is produced in coop-

eration with the University of Nebraska system, which includes the University of Nebraska-Lincoln (UNL) and its Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources (IANR), the University of Nebraska at Omaha (UNO) and the University of Nebraska Medical Center (UNMC).

Each weekly "University Magazine" program will present a special feature story, as well as four regular features — "Up Front," "At Work," "Lifestyle" and "Health." A short "Campus Capsules" segment is also included. Several live call-in programs dealing with a variety of topics are scheduled to be broadcast during the season.

The series' premiere program feature focuses on the education of Afghan refugees living in Pakistan. UNO and its Afghan Studies staff was awarded an educational aid grant to promote Afghan education.
